



Welcome to Ward F3

Ward F3 looks after children from 0-16 years of age.

Some of the children come to F3 to have an operation. Some children come to F3 to have some medicine. F3 has 26 beds.

Directions:

You can find F3 by coming through the main entrance and walking past the hairdressers. Cross straight over the crossroads to the lifts. Use the lifts to go to level 3. Turn left out of the lifts and follow the corridor to F3. When you get to the door, press the bell and the nurses will ask you who you are and then let you in.

Sleeping:

When you arrive you may be asked to wait in the play room or you will be shown to a cot or bed where you will be able to get comfy and put some of your things in the cupboard to keep them tidy.

Visiting:

Your mummy and daddy and other visitors will be able to visit you at any time during your stay. If your mummy, daddy or other visitor is poorly they will be asked to go home.

Who will be looking after me?

You will be looked after by a nurse who will make sure that you have everything you need and tell you what is going to happen.


Meal times:

When you are able to eat, the nurse will be able to give you a choice of food including a sandwich, crisps, yoghurt, biscuits, cereal or toast. If you have a special diet it can be ordered for you.











Things to do:

There is a TV by your bed which is free to use. There is a play room on the ward for you to spend some time in if you want to. There is a play specialist on the ward who will be able to find some things for you to do. You can bring your favourite soft toy/blanket with you if you want to.

Mobile phones:


No mobile phones are to be used on F3 as they may prevent others from resting.


