Construction Update

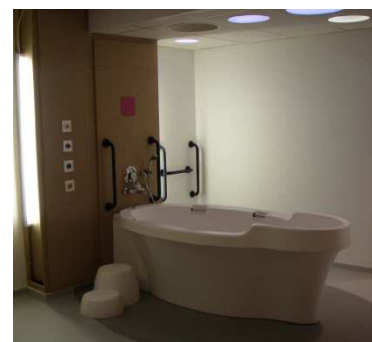
Excellent progress has continued on site. The concrete structure for the main building is now complete, and the steel work frame forming the link between the existing Rosie and new extension has been erected. Within the building all 3 staircases have been installed, the construction of the internal partition walls is well underway on all three floors, and the installation of the mechanical and electrical service modules throughout the building is approximately 60% complete.

Good progress is being made with the basement link tunnel, with the installation of the roof slabs almost complete.



Room mock-ups

As part of the project, a life size mock-up of a Birthing Room, Ultrasound Room and NICU/SCBU cot spaces were created. Clinical Teams, as well as representatives from Infection Control, Manual Handling and Risk Management visited the mock-ups to evaluate the rooms. All team members involved felt that it had been a valuable exercise, particularly in enabling teams to act-out clinical scenarios, highlight operational issues and trial sample equipment. Consolidated feedback has been provided and will be incorporated into the new building as appropriate.
